

They Can Peer Out Window, Watch Their School Grow

Students at Second Ward High School can look out the window these days and see where they will be going to class next September.

Two buildings are being constructed on the Second Ward grounds as additions to the existing school.

They are a shop-home economics building and an art building. Now only a mass of walls and beams, they are expected to be completed by the start of school next fall.

On the first floor of the shop building will be a brick masonry room, a shoe repair shop, an industrial arts hop and a mechanical drawing room.

On the second floor will be a chemistry and physics room, two home economics rooms, a language room and a biology room.

In the art building will be an art room with a display case which will show off student work to the public outside. There will also be a classroom with facilities for teaching by television, a storage room and an "all purpose room."

A covered walkway will connect the main buildings of the schools, and there will be a paved parking lot for students and teachers.

Second Ward's main building, in use now, will continue to be the main building, with the two new buildings giving added

space to take care of an expanding student body.
